The British Council builds connections, understanding and trust between people in the UK and other countries through arts and culture, education and the English language.

We work in two ways – directly with individuals to transform their lives, and with governments and partners to make a bigger difference for the longer term, creating benefit for millions of people all over the world.

We help young people to gain internationally recognised qualifications. Our work in arts and culture stimulates creative expression and exchange and nurtures creative enterprise.

We connect the best of the UK with the world and the best of the world with the UK. These connections lead to an understanding of each other's strengths and of the challenges and values that we share. This builds trust between people in the UK and other nations which endures even when official relations may be strained.

We work on the ground in more than 100 countries.

In 2019-20 we connected with 80 million people directly and with 791 million overall, including online and through our broadcasts and publications.

We have been in the Philippines since 1978. Every year, we connect with thousands of students, educators, policymakers, academics, researchers, creatives and entrepreneurs in the Philippines.

ACT-IHE Going Global Partnerships

The Access and Competitiveness through Internationalisation of Higher Education (ACT-IHE) programme is a new flagship project of the British Council and the Commission on Higher Education (CHED). It seeks to widen access of learners to quality higher education and to build the global competitiveness of Filipino universities.

Together with CHED, we will create new postgraduate degrees offered jointly by UK and Philippine universities, increase student mobility to the UK, enhance English-medium education across Philippine universities and promote a flexible and resilient teaching and learning in the country.

It builds on the success of the Joint Development of Niche Programmes through Philippine-UK Linkages which pioneered Philippine-UK postgraduate degree programmes and resulted to 17 transnational education (TNE) degrees on niche areas that were not available in the Philippines.



Newton Agham Programme

The Newton Agham Programme develops science and innovation partnerships that promote the economic development and social welfare of the Philippines. The programme supports multiyear research and workshop partnerships between Philippine and UK institutions.

We also offer full-time PhD scholarships for Filipino researchers at a UK university. Currently jointly funded with CHED and the Department of Science and Technology, Newton Agham aims to support the production of highly trained researchers in the Philippines with international experience.

The programme focuses on the following local development

- Environment resilience
- Energy security
- Future cities
- Agritech
- Digital, innovation and security

Internationalisation of SMEC

The Internationalisation of South Manila Educational Consortium (SMEC) programme seeks to expand the SMEC members' international collaboration by building their capacities in internationalisation and linking them with their counterparts in the UK.

The partnership was launched in 2016 through a training programme on internationalisation delivered by the Cardiff Metropolitan University to 120 leaders from Philippine universities. This was followed by mission visits and partnership meetings in the UK in 2017 and 2019 to explore a consortium approach to partnerships with UK universities. In 2020, select staff members from SMEC institutions started their Professional Doctorate programme in Aberystwyth University, a unique programme which enables professionals to study for a doctorate through distance learning.

SMEC is a group of 12 higher education institutions in Manila.

The programme supports the consortium's mission of having a globally oriented, internationally competitive faculty and research contribute to their goal of being an



Embedding Internationalisation in Philippine Quality Assurance Standards

The Embedding Internationalisation in Philippine Quality Assurance Standards programme is a collaboration with CHED and the Philippine Association of Colleges and Universities Commission on Accreditation (PACUCOA).

We support accrediting agencies by co-developing a set of metrics in

quality assurance and accreditation standards, specifically to measure internationalisation and performance of Philippine universities based on research, instruction, extension and resource management. Through these partnerships, we help public and private universities institutionalise internationalisation.
