



### Woven Networks Sharing Sessions: A global gathering for changemakers

**'Woven Networks Sharing Sessions'** is an online event that features Woven Networks grantees and their work with forest-dependent craft communities across the Philippines. It is a four-day event that will showcase the role of craft in helping communities and forests to thrive.

The event will focus on the stories of people working together across the Philippines and with the UK to create change through weaving networks that support each other.

It will culminate with the launch of a virtual exhibition that celebrates culture, communities, and forests.

**Woven Networks - Craft changemakers conserving forests** is a one-year partnership between the **Forest Foundation** and the British Council through its **Crafting Futures** global programme. It aims to strengthen the voices of local communities by highlighting their sustainable practices and vital role as artisans, thus growing forest resources and livelihood.

Part of the programme is the **Woven Networks Scoping Grants**, which aim to initiate new collaborations and support projects that champion indigenous knowledge systems towards sustainable resource management and improved livelihood of craft communities.
